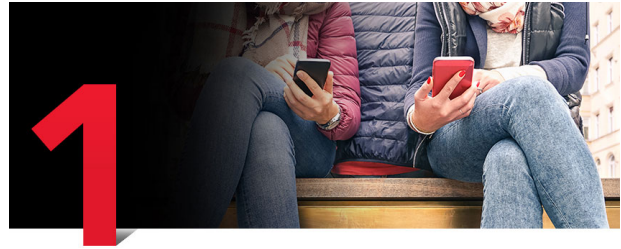
Join the movement. Help raise awareness and put an end to all types of bullying.

That's why it's important that youth group leaders, parents and church leaders know how to recognize cyberbullying and how to respond to it.

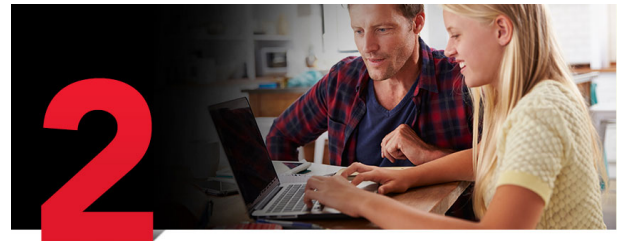
Prepare & Communicate
