Driver Selection Guidelines

The safety of the occupants of your vehicles is our primary concern in establishing guidelines for you to use in selecting your drivers. Experienced, safety-conscious drivers are the key to safe vehicle operation and the prevention of accidents. We urge you to select individuals based on maturity, attitude, and safe driving skills.

1. The driver is the key to safe vehicle operation of a motor vehicle and when it comes to preventing accidents. Select this person with great care, based on the individual's maturity, attitude, and safe driving skills.
2. Driving experience gained by operating motor vehicles under a variety of roadway and weather conditions is invaluable. Drivers with less than four years of licensed driving experience should not be allowed to operate your motor vehicles.
3. Drivers should consult warning labels on all medications before operating a motor vehicle. Individuals should not drive if they are taking any over-the-counter or doctor-prescribed medication that impairs the safe operation of a motor vehicle.
4. Driving while talking or texting on a cellphone puts a driver at a much higher risk of an injury-causing accident. Using a cellphone or other wireless device while driving poses a significant safety risk to the vehicle operator, their passengers, and others on the road. Create and enforce a policy within your organization to ban cellphone use while driving.
5. Vehicles must be properly equipped if a driver has a license restriction.
